





Applying for an Erasmus+/SEMP exchange

Who can apply?

- Students who are enrolled at the FU and complete a study program leading to a recognized degree.
- Students of a joint degree program of the FU and another German university.
- Doctoral candidates who are regularly enrolled at the FU.
- Stays abroad in the main country of residence are not eligible.
- The study period abroad must be part of the study program at the FU.
 Recognition of academic achievements abroad at the FU should be guaranteed.

When do I have to take action?

Erasmus+ studies can be started from the **3rd semester during the Bachelor's degree**, and from the **2nd semester during the Master's programme**. Therefore, please inform yourself about the exchange opportunities via Erasmus+ from the beginning of your studies!

Many institutes and departments offer information events from November to January on the Erasmus+ places offered and provide information about the application process.

Students who have been enrolled several times (combined Bachelor's degree, Master's degree in teaching) can submit an application for each subject or institute/department. A maximum of three online applications can be submitted in total.

Applications from other disciplines to institutes/departments where you are not studying are not permitted!

The Erasmus+ coordinators usually select applicants on the basis of the documents submitted.

- Outside of the periods specified above, the online application form is not available. It cannot be filled in retrospectively.
- All applicants must complete the online application form in full and send it by the deadline so that their application can be considered.
- After sending the online application form, it will be generated as a PDF and can be saved by the students and submitted to the department/institute.

Information on the online application form

- For students of the Department of Law, there is a different procedure for the online application form, about which they will be informed by the department.
- Students can access their online forms in the MoveON Outgoing Portal Erasmus+ Studies and download them as PDFs.
- Subsequent changes to created online forms (status "submitted", generated as PDF) are not possible.
- In case of technical problems, students should contact the Erasmus+ Team FU (Outgoing), <u>outgoing-erasmus@fu-berlin.de</u> by e-mail before the respective application deadline and describe the problems.

Notes on language proficiency

Current proof of language proficiency (in accordance with the requirements of the partner university)

- <u>CEFR</u> language certificates can be issued by the <u>FU Language Center</u>.
- As a template, the language certificate of the FU Language Center can be used (German/English).

Central Language Tests of the FU Language Center

Participation in the language tests is only intended for FU/Charité students who have not attended or are not attending a language course at the Language Center.

Spanish: 21.01.2025, 06.05.2025 (for applicants for remaining places summer semester 2025), registration required by 14.01.2025 or 29.04.2025 via an e-mail form at the latest

French: 13.01.2025, registration via an e-mail form required (no further dates in the winter semester, one date planned in summer semester 2025, in principle no individual dates)

English: The appointments are made by the secretariat of the Language Center. Students should contact the secretary's office as soon as possible and in good time before the application deadline, stating the latest submission or late submission deadline for the language certificate, by telephone during office hours (Tue & Wed 10:30 a.m. to 1:30 p.m., Tel.: 030/83854504) or by e-mail (sprachenzentrum@fu-berlin.de).

Selection criteria

- Quality of the letter of motivation
- Quality of the study project abroad
- Individual Academic Achievements
- Commitment to the department / social commitment
- Language skills
- The catalogue can be extended by the department/institute with additional criteria.

Questions about the selection criteria and the timing of the selection/allocation of places can be answered by the Erasmus+ coordinators at the institute/department.

The selection must be finished by the end of March at the latest (or by the end of May).

Recommendations for the application

- Find out whether the partner universities offered by your institute/department are suitable for your field of study.
- Check whether you meet the academic and language requirements of the partner universities (e.g. proof with the transcript of records that a certain number of ECTS have been completed in full at the FU).
- Find out about the semester dates of the partner universities (lecture start/end, exam start/end), as these often differ from those at the FU.
- Find out about the housing situation on site in the host country/host town.
- Prepare yourself linguistically for studying abroad in good time and make sure you have an up-to-date proof of language proficiency. There are not always (sufficient) courses offered in English, so knowledge of the national language (possibly regional language such as Catalan) is required.
- Take a look at the current course catalog of the partner universities to get an impression of the courses offered and the languages of instruction.
- If you have several subjects at the FU: Apply via the subject (the institute) that you would like to study mainly at the partner university. There is no guarantee that you will be able to study your all of your subject(s) at the host university.
- In your letter of motivation, please refer to the partner universities and make a reference to your current studies at the FU. Why are these universities interesting for studying abroad (course offerings, research focus)? Make it clear that you have informed yourself about the partner universities and have made a conscious choice.

Funding conditions, financing

Duration of stay per stay abroad

- minimum 2 months (60 days), exception: trimester/terms less than 2 months
- maximum 12 months (360 days)
- > length of stay depends on the semester dates of the partner universities

Maximum duration of Erasmus+ participation

- 12 months in the first cycle of studies (BA or equivalent) including internships and graduate internships
- 12 months in the second cycle of studies (MA or equivalent) including internships and graduate internships
- for single-cycle courses of study (e.g. medicine, law, pharmacy, veterinary medicine), a total duration of 24 months applies
- 12 months in the doctoral phase

Repeat participation in the Erasmus+ programme

is possible up to a total period of 12 months per study cycle (24 months for state examinations/law examinations), taking into account the minimum and maximum duration of stay per mobility activity.

Previous months and days already funded will be credited towards the maximum possible 12 months per study cycle (24 months for state examinations/law examinations).

Examples

- 4 months Erasmus+ studies in winter semester 2025/26 in France
 5 months Erasmus+ studies in the summer semester 2026 in Italy
 (however, the beginning and end of the semester dates must not overlap)
- (2) 5 months of study abroad have already been completed in the BA via Erasmus+
 7 months could still be funded in the BA via Erasmus+ (studies/internship/graduate internship)
 e.g. 5 months of study abroad and 2 months of internship for graduates

Funding conditions

Completion of courses worth at least 15 ECTS per semester including participation in and passing the examinations of the partner university, all semester periods/blocks must be covered by courses.

Erasmus+ Financial Support

The **Erasmus+ funding period** is determined by us before the start of the study abroad and corresponds to the expected duration of study at the host university. The regular semester dates are used for the start date and end date (see <u>MoveON Publisher</u>).

- > Introduction/welcome days, lecture period, regular examination period
- If the study period differs from the semester dates, e.g. because students are doing (research) internships, students must inform us by e-mail about the individually agreed period.
- If students take courses at UNIS instead of at the actual partner university in Norway, we need to be informed as early as possible. The Erasmus+ funding period then depends on the UNIS course periods.

Erasmus+ Financial Support

- For the academic year 2025/26, the financial support is fixed in July 2025.
- FU outgoing students will be informed by us about the financial support and the funding conditions (start winter semester 2025/26: July 2025, start summer semester 2026: October 2025).

Erasmus+ Financial Support

- Additional top-up amount fewer opportunities possible (currently 2024/25: 250 euros/month) for
 - Students with child(ren),

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- Students with disabilities from GB 20,
- Students with a chronic illness (medically certified additional need abroad due to the illness),
- Students from non-academic parents (first-time academic),
- Students with a part-time job (other than self-employment) that had to be given up due to studying abroad and
 - that has been exercised continuously for at least 6 months since 01.06.2024,
 - with a monthly net salary of more than 450 euros and less than 850 euros,
 - the activity is terminated before the start of the stay abroad or is paused abroad > loss of earnings (no home office, no continued payment of wages, no paid vacation).
- If several target group characteristics apply (e.g. first-time academic and employed student): the top-up amount can only be paid for one target group characteristic, i.e. it cannot be combined.
- Participants with disabilities, chronic illnesses and participants with child(ren) can claim real costs.
- Additional financed travel days possible (currently 2024/25: respective country rate per day)

Swiss European Mobility Programme / SEMP

Switzerland: financial support

SEMP students can receive a financial grant from the Swiss government for their stay in Switzerland.

By applying for the exchange at the partner university, you are also applying for the grant.

However, your acceptance as an exchange student from the partner university is no guarantee that you will receive one.

The financial support is paid by the Swiss partner university. The amount of the grant is currently CHF 2,200 per semester (approx. 2,000 euros).

Students with other scholarships

- Simultaneous funding via Erasmus+ and other EU programs is not possible.
- Simultaneous funding via Erasmus+ and PROMOS is not possible.
- Scholarship holders of funding agencies, foundations, DAAD, etc. must inform them about Erasmus+ funding and have the scholarship provider check whether simultaneous funding is permissible. If the additional financial support via Erasmus+ is not possible, students must inform us by email. In this case, the Erasmus+ place will be funded without an Erasmus+ grant (Zero Grant Mobility).
- BAföG abroad can be received in addition to Erasmus+.

Notes on Auslands-BAföG

- Financing of partial or full education at a university as well as compulsory internships within the EU and Switzerland
- Minimum duration of the stay abroad: 6 months (1 semester) or 12 weeks as part of a university cooperation and compulsory internships
- No domestic BAföG? > you may still be entitled to BAföG abroad, apply for a preliminary decision
- Proof required that the stay abroad is conducive to training in Germany
- Funding abroad usually for a maximum of 1 year, will not be counted towards the standard period of study (maximum duration of BAföG funding can therefore be extended by 1 year)
- separate application to the office responsible for the destination country


